

# TERCHER TIP FROM MS... LAURA

### 9 Ways to Empower Reluctant Writers

Have you ever asked your child to write about a topic, only to have them stare blankly at the page or say, "I don't know what to write"? It happens to us all, but like everything in life, developing as a writer takes practice. Here are a few ways to empower reluctant writers:

#### 1. Make a personal connection.

Be sure to identify and engage with students' interests outside of school.

#### 2. Invite students to write about personal interests.

To develop writing confidence, ask students to write about their own interests and experiences.

#### 3. Offer choice.

When possible, offer choice in writing topics, or offer several topic options for a more specific writing assignment.

#### 4. Immerse students in good writing.

It is important for students to read models of effective writing, especially within their reading book or independent reading.

#### 5. Model effective reading and writing strategies.

Write with students and discuss the challenges or mistakes made which leads to revising and editing.

#### 6. Balance freedom and structure.

Support students' personal thoughts and let them take risks in their writing. Breaking long writing assignments into smaller steps can provide the structure needed to tackle the assignment.

#### 7. Focus feedback on solutions, not problems.

Instead of highlighting the errors, celebrate the successes and ask questions to further students' thinking about their own writing.

#### 8. Be flexible about correctness.

Rather than pointing out every mistake, pick one or two common errors (grammar, punctuation, spelling, etc.) to focus on for editing practice.

#### 9. Make time for reflection.

Celebrate the completion of writing assignments and ask questions about the easiest/hardest part of their writing, how they organized their details, or the part that they liked best.
